**MATTERS** ARISING

Community Investment Update . Dog Island project . carried forward to the next meeting.

Royalties summary provided to the Panel by Anna (in Dropbox). well received. Discussion around political parties views, and likelihood that if a change of government, and/or if a big discovery in a new region (ie Otago/Southland) then topic of regional royalties likely to be on the table.

Discussion re continued support for the Warm Homes project (2+1 year). Overall ites a good programme, works well, community supported. Panel agreed to support a 3rd year of funding in principle, but is dependant upon 2018 budget which is yet to be confirmed. Anna commented it could become a corporate project rather than a panel project. Anna to ask Cosy Homes for update on range of options for funding (in addition to EECAcs insulation for landlordsqprogramme).

REPORT CARD AND LOE

Philip circulated a summary of the panel members input to 2016-17 Report Card for NZOG, which was formally adopted . moved Bridget seconded John

It was noted that the Herecs where the Panel sees room for improvement gsection in the Report Card should be capured as new expectations in the next LOE as it is a direct loop re any future devlopments that the panel feels that NZOG may need to be doing, reflected into a number of themes. Anna suggested the Panel discuss and refine the area of concern raised at this and last few meetings which broadly relate to NZOGs climate change response, investigation in to renewables business development, actions to reduce environmental footprint etc. Bridget volunteered to capture this and draft up the next LOE for circulation and

comment.

SUSTAINABILITY REPORTING

Anna (again) tabled the 2016 Sustainability Report and explained the concept behind the Sustainability Materiality Matrix, with a view to refreshing it for 2017. The Matrix looks at ranking sustainability issues taking into account feedback from the panel. shareholders, regulatory bodies etc. She noted that NZOG has currently reduced its environmental impacts and touchpoints due **Bridget** 

to changing assets (ie sold out of most of its assets). However Sustainabilty process important for screening new ventures/opportunities. Discussion around the importance of maintaining environmental footprint mitigation (and broader questions re climate change impacts and mitigation actions) suggested the Panel wanted environmental issues to remain high, despite actualq impact being minimal if taking a slice in timeq approach. Anna to sumamrise the discussion and make changes to the Matrix, circulating to the Panel for confirmation. Also ensure issues are captured in new LoE for 2017.

Anna informed the panel of the following

### NZOG – ACTIVITIES UPDATE

- NZOG was to launch the Regional Economic Impact Assessment report (Clipper Permit/Barque Prospect) but this was delayed by a JV partner review, and further held up by take-over offer process. Now expected to bre released in September. Anna to provide Panel with summary document, and confirm process for media questions.
- All Panel encouraged to let NZOG know of themes of feedback/questions from their networks.[ACTION. Phil to add as an Agenda item and capture as separate entry in Minutes]
- The takeover bid for NZOG by a large shareholder and Board Member, was discussed with an update provided by Anna following her recent email. Independent valuations are in progress and she will keep us up to date as things develop.
- The Clipper project has some interested parties with the October deadline looming.
- The Toroa (off the coast of Bluff) project is still progressing and has 2019 drill/drop time table.

# COMMUNITY INVESTMENT UPDATE

Otago Science Fair August 7 to 13 was successful with good number of entries and a high standard was noted. a special ment ion was made of the Matauranga Maori entries.

The Southland Science Fair is due for September and Tessa will report back in November.

#### GENERAL BUSINESS

Anna tabled the joint Runaka policy document on the Oil and Gas Industry after her attendance at the Puketeraki Marae. The Report is about a connecting process for lwi and others to consider re exploration activities. Anna offered to pay for copies if Panel memers wanted for their networds (Two members took this up).

Anna circulated the latest report from PEPANZ An Introduction to New Zealands Oil and Gas Industryg

John commented upon being kept in the loop as more publicity is anticipated in the comming months and Anna to provide this in addition to any questions or comments from panel members networks.

The panel noted Gillians 2018 departure and to look at panel members continuing membership going forward. John also looking to move to Central Otago next year and consider role on Panel at that time.
